

General Requirements for licensing of health facilities under Act 829

1. Overview

Section 11 (1 and 2) of Act 829 (2011) provides:

- 1) That a person shall not operate a facility unless the facility is licensed under this Act.
- 2) That a person shall not operate equipment in a facility specified in the first schedule unless the facility in which the person operates is licensed under this Act.

2. Facilities to be licensed by HeFRA under ACT 829 as outlined in the first schedule of Act 829

- Medical and Dental (Health centers, clinics and hospitals)
- Eye care clinic
- Convalescent and nursing homes
- Geriatric homes
- Maternity homes
- Occupational therapy clinic
- Physiotherapy clinics
- Dental technology laboratory
- Clinical and biomedical laboratory
- Medical assistant clinic
- Diagnostic imaging technology clinic
- Pharmacies and chemical shops
- Osteopathy clinic
- Prosthetics and orthotics clinic;
- And any other healthcare clinic or premises that may be determined by the Minister.


3. The licensing process is as follows:

- 1. Secure a free application form from any of the offices of HeFRA or download form from our website.
- 2. Complete application form with the required documents and information.
- 3. Submit the completed application form with attached documents and a fee for the registration process.
- 4. HeFRA staff will verify the forms and attached documents.
- 5. After a successful verification an inspection letter is issued to the facility to prepare for an inspection.

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- 6. If HeFRA confirms a positive recommendation for the facility to operate, then a licence is issued to enable the facility to operate.
- 7. In cases where HeFRA finds the inspection report unsatisfactory, a period of time is given to the facility to address these issues satisfactorily for re-inspection before a licence is issued.





Application for a license to operate a facility (General Requirements)

To register to operate a facility:

- (1) Visit HeFRA offices around the country in order to secure an approved application form. The form can also be downloaded from our website. www.hefra.gov.gh
- (2) Complete the application form and attach the following documents to the application form (Act 829 section 12(2a-2j)
- (a) The block plan of the facility for the practice;
- (b) If applicable preliminary approval from the District/Municipal/Metropolitan planning authority of the District/Municipal/Metropolitan Assembly on the suitability of the land and/or facility to be used for the practice;
- (c) Clearance from the Environmental Protection Agency.
- (d) Plans for the disposal of medical waste;
- (e) Copies of certificates of proposed practitioners in the practice and proof of their up-todate registration with their professional bodies;
- (f) List of the types of services to be rendered;
- (g) List of equipment (as per facility) to be used for the service applied for.
- (h) Evidence of financial capability for the ownership and operation of the practice applied for (audited accounts, statement of account etc) if applicable.
- (i) The prescribed fee (see attached).

Additionally, applicants shall provide

- (j) Original copies of business registration Certificates from the Registrar General's Departments if applicable.
- (k) Approved certification for facilities with X Ray imaging from the Nuclear Regulatory Authority
- (l) Evidence of submission of health service data to Ministry of Health every 3 months. (Existing facilities only) or as directed by the Minister
- (m) A clearance certificate from Ghana Fire service



(3) A yearly retention fee will be paid depending in order to retain the facility name in the facilities register (see Price list attached)

o) For non- Ghanaian applicant only

Section 13 (1 and 2) of Act 829 (2011) provides:

- 1) A person who is not a citizen may apply to the Agency to own or operate a practice in a facility if that person;
 - o possesses a valid work permit issued by the Minister for the Interior
 - o is registered with the appropriate regulatory professional body in Ghana
 - o has at least five years post qualification experience in a recognized institution of relevance to the profession of the practice
 - o has a Ghanaian professional in a similar discipline as business partner
 - o has fulfilled any other conditions set by the Board
- (2) A person who is not a citizen shall not own or operate a facility unless that person has practised in the profession in the country for at least one year in a recognised institution.

NOTE: a licence issued shall be displayed in a prominent place which is accessible to patients and the clients in the premises of the practice. (Act 829 Section 19)
